
The mission of the museum is to preserve Ukrainian cultural and historical artifacts and educate the general public about Ukrainian contributions to America.


At the invitation of **UNWLA Branch 53**, I presented an overview UAAM'a 60 year history in October 2018 at a meeting of their branch.

Worked with the **Oakland University press** contact whose article was picked up by the **Oakland Press**.





Operations Update

Climate control

Installation of vents and heating & cooling units on 2nd floor of new museum in order to preserve the archives and collections.

There is a work area that we will be able to use now.





Operations Update

- Installation of internet at new museum (June 2018)
- Climate control 2nd floor new museum
 - New heating & cooling units
 - Window insulation to block sunlight in archival areas
- Removal of toilets, sinks and radiators from upstairs
- Issue with Polar Vortex in early February and pipes freezing in basement of new museum no damage
- Flood in Charest museum in late January. Water flooded from toilet tank on the 2nd floor which flooded the main floor.
 - Remediation company worked for 1 week to remove water which meant knocking out walls and removing flooring
 - Insurance company covered the cost of remediation and replacement costs which we applied to the cost of the move.



- Chumak Way cyclists visited Detroit in July 2018 and visited the Museum. They were impressed with the EKO collection and Lys Mykyta








Shevchenko Scientific Society









RESEARCH

Special Lecturer **Donna Voronovich**, Department of Art and Art History, will moderate a conversation among individuals who were personally affected by the events of April 26, 1986. By sharing their poignant stories, the panelists will provide the audience with an opportunity to reflect on the ramifications of this profound human tragedy.

Ulana Ohar-Kushner is a Ukrainian American filmmaker and Chemobyl "liquidator." She served on the board of directors for Chornobyl Union International—a confederate organization headquartered in Kyiv—produced the made-for-television documentary Chornobyl Tragedy and Hope (1996), and has contributed to many other Chernobyl aid initiatives. In 1997, she received the Chornobyl Union Humanitarian Award and continues to lobby on behalf of the victims.



Halyna Shovkoshytna was evacuated from Prypiat with her husband and children in the fateful days following the Chernobyl nuclear accident. Along with thousands of other residents, they left their homes believing they would soon return. Instead, they were "resettled" in Kyiv in government housing and forced to rebuild their lives. In the years since, both she and her husband have worked with various organizations in Ukraine and abroad to educate the world about the humanitarian, economic, and cultural costs of this nuclear tragedy.




Ivanna Voronovych is a student of public policy at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. In May 1986, thousands of children from Kyiv were forcibly separated from their parents and sent by train to Crimea, where they remained for several months until conditions in Kyiv were determined to be safe. Among them were Ivanna Voronovych's mother and siblings. She will speak of that experience on behalf of her family.



Steve Andre, an American freelance photojournalist, has traveled to Ukraine several times since 2010 to document the Chernobyl Exclusion Zone, as well as the war being fought in the eastern regions of the country. Over the course of nine visits to the Zone, he has befriended several elders who have returned to their native villages, in spite of the risks associated with constant exposure to radiation.







